Molluscum Contagiosum and swimming

Molluscum contagiosum is a common skin infection caused by the molluscum contagiosum virus (MCV). The virus causes small, raised spots that can be spread by skin-to-skin contact, it can also be spread by students sharing baths or pools. Molluscum is painless but can be itchy. When the spots appear they look like pimples. Over time they become round, pink or pearl-coloured lumps with a hard core and often a dimple in the centre. The spots are usually very small, but they can be as large as two centimetres. Students with open sores or breaks from any cause should not go into swimming pools. If students with molluscum are participating in our school swimming program, they should:

- Cover all visible lesions with watertight bandages
- Dispose of all used bandages at home
- Not share towels, kick boards, other equipment, or toys

We ask that parents make your child's teacher aware if your child has this skin infection.

Students not participating in the Swimming Program

Non swimmers will be required to attend the swimming pool at their class' designated lesson time where they will sit poolside and complete a swimming booklet created to teach them about water safety and swimming.

Do you have a child who is school age for 2024? Are they School Ready?

'School readiness' is a measure of the knowledge, skills and behaviours that enable children to participate and succeed in school. Parents sometimes think that school readiness means being able to read, write and do basic maths before starting school. But this isn't the case! School readiness is about the development of the whole child – their social and emotional skills, physical skills, communication skills and cognitive skills. Children cannot thrive at school if they haven't developed the skills to manage things like getting along with other children, following instructions, and communicating their needs.

Research shows that children who start school when developmentally ready to learn tend to do better in school – and it sets them up for further success later in life.

School Readiness TIP #1

Try to arrange playdates with other children starting at the same school. This gives your little one the chance to develop their social skills - and give them the confidence that they will have a friend to talk to when they start school.

Similarly any father who wishes to assist his daughter change will also need to use that separate change room or utilise the main pool deck.



School Attendance Tips for Parents

*Schools want to work in partnership with parents – act early if you have any concerns by contacting your child's school and asking for advice and support

- * Remember that every day counts
- * There is no safe number of days for missing school each day a student misses puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes and their social connectedness
 - * Talk positively about school and the importance of attending every day
 - * Open and prompt communication with us about all absences is a good idea.
- * Avoid making routine medical and dental appointments during the school day or planning family holidays during the term
- * Seek help from our school attendance officer or wellbeing coordinator if you are concerned about your child's attendance and wellbeing.

Our school wants to work in partnership with parents to support student attendance and wellbeing.

4. From the drop down menu, click on search books




5. Enter the title and author, click search. Then locate the book from the list and click the title.

6. Details of the book will then appear and click add book.

7. Then click Dashboard and you will be taken to your child's dashboard where you will see the book listed. Click Finish

Camps, Sports, Excursion Fund (CSEF) \$\$\$

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

· \$125 for primary school students

HOW TO APPLY


New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Applications should be lodged as soon as possible, with schools accepting them until 23rd June



ANZAC BISCUITS

- 1 cup plain flour
- 1 cup sugar (brown or raw)
- 1 cup rolled oats
- 1 cup coconut
- 125g butter
- 3 tablespoons golden syrup
- 1/2 teaspoon bi-carb soda in 1 tablespoon boiling water

Melt butter and syrup in saucepan. Add soda/water and watch the volcano effect! Mix dry ingredients in a bowl. Pour butter/soda mixture over and mix well. Place spoonfuls on a tray and cook at 160c until golden. Leave to cool on tray.


REMINDER - BIKE ED EXCURSION








MELTON PRIMARY SCHOOL'S AGREED BEHAVIOURS
