Grade 2


The grade 2s have been busy learning all about procedural texts. They had to learn to play a new game and then write the steps needed to play, ready to teach someone else.






















Grade 4

2023 Book Week


We invite all parents, carers and grandparents to our 2023 Whole School Book Week Parade!
