Dear Parents/Guardians,

Welcome Our New Students

Welcome to the 2024 school year, it is great to see all of our students returned refreshed ready for the new school year. We trust all of our families had a relaxing and enjoyable holiday break. We would like to **welcome to Melton Primary School our new Foundation students and all new students from Grades 1 - 6**. We hope that all of the existing Melton PS families will introduce themselves and make the new families to Melton feel very welcome.

Staffing Update

You may have seen or read recently in the media that schools in Victoria are struggling with staffing their classrooms with teachers for the 2024 school year. I am pleased to advise that Melton Primary School is fortunate to have all of the teachers that we require for 2024.

This year we welcome to our teaching staff, Danielle Speranza (PE) and Jenna Connor (Grade 1). We also welcome back to MPS Stephanie Wilson. Please make all of these staff feel welcomed.

2 Days of Assessment and Parent Teacher Interviews

Thank you to all of our families for your support of our first 2 days of assessment and our parent teacher interviews. This enabled our teachers to have valuable 1:1 time with our students and the opportunity to get to know them.

Photo Privacy

It is great that people want to share photos of their child/ren on social media like Facebook and Instagram, but it is vital that you seek permission from other parent's if you wish to share a photo/movie clip of other people's children. Please consider others and show courtesy by asking permission before you share. As a school we have sought publishing permission from each family so that we can publish photos and student work on our website, Facebook page and brochures.

Students should not be onsite prior to 8:15am unsupervised

Teachers officially start work at 8:18am with the first teacher on yard duty from 8:30am. Students should not be in the school yard prior to 8:15am unsupervised. Parents needing to have their child on site prior to 8:15am are required to utilise the Out of School Hours Care service. If students are on site prior to 8:15am unsupervised, parents will be contacted to collect them.

Tutor Program

This year we will continue to provide a tutor program designed for learning catch up and extension. A number of different programs operate throughout our school based on student learning needs.

To determine students who are participating in the programs, staff look at assessment results, work effort and student attendance. In order for the programs to be fluid and sequential it is imperative that students participating in these programs are at school as often as possible. In 2024 we will be operating the following programs:

Literacy - MiniLit (catch up), LLI (catch up and extension)

Maths - tutor Numeracy (catch up and extension)

Students will participate in these programs for different periods of time. For some of these programs there is an expectation that students complete additional homework. It is vital that families work with the school to ensure that this is done.

If your child has been identified to commence one of these programs this term, you will be contacted shortly by the teacher. Thank you for working with us to catch up and extend students.

Teachers are available from 8:30am

Should you need to speak to your child's teacher before school, teachers are available from 8:30am. Prior to 8:30am, teachers are preparing for their day so I ask that you do not interrupt them, please contact the office who can pass a message onto your child's teacher.

Mutually Agreeable Appointment

Please be advised that on Monday and Tuesday afternoons, the staff participate in meetings commencing at 3:20pm. If you need to see a teacher for an extended period of time, please make an appointment with them at a mutually agreeable time. If you are running late to pick your child up, please ensure that you contact the school so that we can inform your child. This often relieves any stress or anxiety that they may feel with you not being there at 3:00pm. Parents of students not collected by 3:10pm will be contacted by the office.

Maria Papaemmanouil is our attendance officer. Each day she will make contact with families of students who are absent where the school has not been notified in relation to a reason for their absence. She will also work with families whose children have an excessive number of absences. School attendance is important. If your child/ren are not at school we are unable to teach them. In order for your child to be considered for our end of year awards, they must have above 85% attendance. Students in Grade 6 must have above 80% attendance in order to receive an invitation to our Grade 6 Graduation.

How many days is regular attendance, below average attendance and poor attendance in a semester (over 2 terms)?

0-6 days - This is within the normal range. A child with this attendance is able to take full advantage of the teaching and learning programs available to them.

7-10 days - This attendance rate is below average. A child with this attendance rate could miss over one year of schooling between Foundation and Year 10.

11 – 20 days – This is a poor attendance rate. A child with this attendance rate could miss over two and a half years of schooling between Foundation and Year 10

Late Arrival and Early Pick Up

If your child arrives late to school or needs to be collected before the end of the school day, we ask that you ensure that you come to the office where your child will be signed in or signed out using the Compass kiosk. It is vital that this is kept up to date, in the event of an emergency this is where we locate all of attendance information. If you are in the school grounds for longer than 10 minutes we ask that you sign in using the Compass kiosk located in the foyer near the office.

Change of details

It is vital that if you have changed your mobile phone number or address that you ensure that you notify the school of your change of details. It is the **responsibility of all families to ensure that the school has current and up to date contact details for parents and emergency contacts.** Please ensure that you inform the office of your current details.

Our School Captains will be hosting our whole school assembly three times a term. This will consist of two online and one face to face assembly. Parents are welcome to come into their child's classroom to view assembly when it is online and join us for our face to face celebration assembly. For our online assemblies, we will send out the electronic link to families via Class Dojo and Compass so that parents who are working can watch it at work.

40km Speed Limit Around Schools

A reminder that the speed limit around the school is 40 km per hour and that this is routinely monitored by the law enforcement throughout the year.

Parking Around the School

Parking around the school can be an issue at the start of the day and at the end of the school day. A number of families were fined by the local council last year for parking on the grass area next to the gravel car park opposite the school on Raleigh's Road. We encourage our families to part drive and part walk. Park your car a couple of streets away and walk with your child to school. A defined carpark has been created behind the scout hall to provide additional parking.

<u>Sunsmart</u>

Until the end of April, all students and staff are required to wear a school hat at recess and lunchtime. If your child has misplaced their hat and you wish to purchase a new one, please come to the office to do so.

House Teams

Each student across the school is assigned to a house team. Melton Primary has four houses – Acacia, Grevillea, Blue Gums and Callistemon. Students are able to wear their sports team colour in the form of a plain t.shirt on the day in which their class has physical education. If you do not know which house your child is in, please see your child's classroom teacher.

Prevent Lost Property

To help us return any lost property, we ask that you clearly label your child's lunch box, school uniform, art smock and library bag. A lost property tub is located in the foyer of the office. This is where we place all unlabeled items. Each classroom also has their own lost property tub, so it is important that you check there also if your child loses an item.

Compass App

We encourage all of our families to download the Melton Primary School Compass App. Via the Compass app you are able to notify the school of your child's absence, book parent teacher interviews, make payments, electronically sign permission forms and view your child's reports (some of these items you need to open the browser in order to complete). For further instructions on how to access the application, please contact the office for your individual login details.

If you require assistance navigating Compass or help logging in please contact the office.

Headlice

3 Keys to your child's educational success

- 1. Reading daily (share a book)
- 2. Attending school daily
- 3. Talk with your child (build their vocabulary)

We encourage all of our families to check their child's hair on a weekly basis. If live lice are found, students are not to come to school until they have been treated. If eggs are found, families will need to comb their child's hair, to ensure all eggs are removed. Already we have been notified of students who have had live lice.

Mobile Phones

The Department of Education Policy is that any students with a mobile phone are to hand it into the office at the start of the school. At the end of the day, students can collect their phone from the office. Students are not permitted to have mobile phones in the classroom. If a student is found to have a mobile phone in the classroom, it will be retained and held in the office until a parent can come in and collect it.

School Council

The Melton Primary School, School Council is made up of a range of staff, parents and community members who work together to set and work towards the key goals and targets of the school.

PRIVACY INFORMATION for parents and carers

During the ordinary course of your child's attendance at our school, school staff will collect your child's personal and health information when necessary to educate your child, or to support your child's social and emotional wellbeing or health in the school context. Such information will also be collected when required to fulfil a legal obligation, including duty of care, anti-discrimination law and occupational health and safety law. If that information is not collected, the school may be unable to provide optimal education or support to your child, or fulfil those legal obligations.

For example, health information may be collected through the school nurse, primary welfare officer or wellbeing staff member. If your child is referred to a specific health service at school, such as a Student Support Services officer, the required consent will be obtained. Our school also collects information provided by parents and carers through the School Entrance Health Questionnaire (SEHQ) and the Early Childhood Intervention Service (ECIS) Transition Form.

From the Privacy INFORMATION for parents and carers continued...

Our school may use online tools, such as apps and other software, to effectively collect and manage information about your child for teaching and learning purposes, parent communication and engagement; student administration; and school management purposes. When our school uses these online tools, we take steps to ensure that your child's information is secure. If you have any concerns about the use of these online tools, please contact us.

School staff will only share your child's personal or health information with other staff who need to know to enable the school to educate or support your child, or fulfil a legal obligation.

When our students transfer to another Victorian government school, personal and health information about that student will be transferred to that next school. Transferring this information is in the best interests of our students and assists that next school to provide optimal education and support to students.

In some limited circumstances, information may be disclosed outside of the school (and outside of the Department of Education and Training). The school will seek your consent for such disclosures unless the disclosure is allowed or mandated by law. Our school values the privacy of every person. When collecting and managing personal and health information, all school staff must comply with Victorian privacy law. School Council

Calls for nominations for School Council.

What is a school council and what does it do?

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally constituted bodies that are given powers to set the key directions of a school within statewide guidelines. In doing this, a school council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

Who is on the school council?

For most school councils, there are three possible categories of membership:

- A mandated elected Parent category more than one-third of the total members must be from this category. Department of Education (DE) employees can be Parent members at their child's school as long as they are not engaged in work at the school.
 A mandated elected DE employee category members of this category may make up no more than one-third of the total membership of school council. The principal of the school is automatically one of these members.
- An optional Community member category members are co opted by a decision of the council because of their special skills, interests or experiences. DE employees are not eligible to be Community members.

Generally, the term of office for all members is two years. The term of office of half the members expires each year, creating vacancies for the annual school council elections.

School Council Notice of an Election and Call for Nominations

An election is to be conducted for members of the School Council of Melton Primary School. Nomination forms **may be obtained from the school office** and **must be lodged by 4:00pm on Monday 12th February 2024.** The ballot will close at 4:00pm on 26th February 2024.

Following the closing of nominations a list of the nominations received will be posted at the school. The terms of office, membership categories and number of positions in each membership category open for election are as follows:




Reporting your child absent on the Compass app

Responding to the absence text message from Compass

New department guidelines require the school to contact the parents/carers of all students marked as not present on the first day of an absence. All parents/carers will receive a text message at 9.45am on the first day of the absence with a link that will allow you to provide consent for the absence directly through Compass. Please refer to the process below:



Student Attendance tips for parents!

* Schools want to work in partnership with parents – act early if you have any concerns by contacting your child's school and asking for advice and support

* Remember that every day counts


* There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a student misses puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes and their social connectedness

* Talk positively about school and the importance of attending every day

* Open and prompt communication with your child's school about all absences is a good idea

* Avoid making routine medical and dental appointments during the school day or planning family holidays during the term

* Seek help from your school if you are concerned about your child's attendance and wellbeing. Schools want to work in partnership with parents to support student attendance and wellbeing.



Hello, Melton Primary School Families,

Student Attendance is really important to us! We understand that at times there are reasons your child/ren may not be at school, however it is important that a reason is given for absences as part of Departmental regulations and is entered on our systems.

This can be done by; -

- 1. Calling the school office or Absence line.
- 2. Entering an absence on the Compass App.
- 3. Dojo your classroom teacher or Administration team member.

If your child has more than 2 consecutive days off school, we ask that you please provide a medical certificate to keep on file. If there is another reason your child may have a large number of absences, please contact the school or myself directly, with the type of absence in order to make note of this on our system.

Please contact us if you have any further queries or if we can offer any extra assistance.



Celebration of Attendance

At Melton Primary School we love to reward children for the amazing attendance and therefore we have a number of different initiatives in place

Monthly awards for children with excellent 100% attendance.





Termly awards for children with 100%, 95% and 90% attendance.



Absences accepted, and are reflected in the number of days of absences in the above Gold, Silver & Bronze awards for the termly certificates are medical illness, bereavement and school approved leave only.

35 nights reading is the goal!

All students should have received their take home readers last week.

Our goal is for every child in the school to read 35+ nights during term 1! Reading each night and on weekends counts!

It is simple, listen to your child read, sign their reading diary/school diary and that is one night completed! Repeat 34 more times during the term and your child will receive a merit ribbon from the members of our Principal Class team!



Camps, Sports, Excursion Fund (CSEF) \$\$\$

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

• \$150 for primary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Applications should be lodged as soon as possible, with schools accepting them until the end of term 2.



Who are we and what do we do?

State Schools' Relief (SSR) is a not-for-profit organisation that improves the lives of tens of thousands of disadvantaged Victorian students, and their families, each year. **SSR provides government school students in need** with new uniforms, footwear and a range of other essential educational resources. We work side by side with all primary, secondary, specialist and language schools to ensure that **any students facing hardship** have the necessary items they require for school.

How is assistance provided?

All requests for support received by State Schools' Relief are treated sympathetically and in confidence. Assistance in the form of clothing items or footwear is supplied directly from our own stock, where possible, and is delivered directly to your school free of charge.

Where a voucher is provided in lieu of physical items, usually because the request is for a logoed item, the voucher is emailed to the school, and the retailer, for the student/family to use towards purchases from the school uniform shop or uniform retailer. Vouchers provided by SSR are for a specified amount and will require a gap payment, as different retailers have varying retail prices.





State Schools' Relief provides support to any Victorian student attending a government school (primary, secondary or specialist), on the advice of the school vouching for the fact that the student is disadvantaged and in need.

Schools can submit an application using the <u>State Schools' Relief Portal</u>, whenever they believe there is a need to support a student whose family/carers are facing difficulty in providing the appropriate uniform, footwear or educational items for attending school.




Lightning Premiership
