




Making a booking


The user can click the notification to proceed to make a booking.

When they click the notification, they will be taken into that specific cycle. If a Description was included in the cycle settings, the user will see this information. They can click either 'Start Booking Now' or 'Show me How to Book' to proceed'.









2025 Foundation Enrolments

Statewide timeline for Foundation (Prep) enrolments. Steps to enrol your child in Foundation (Prep) for the 2025 school year

To start primary school in 2025, your child will need to turn 5 years old by 30 April 2025. Schooling is compulsory for children who have turned 6 years old. If your child is starting Foundation (Prep) in 2025, you will be able to apply to enrol your child in a Victorian government primary school from the start of Term 2, 2024 (Monday 15 April 2024).

What you need to do:

- 1. Use Find my School to locate your designated neighbourhood school (referred to as your local school) and other nearby government schools.
- 2. Contact a government primary school to book a school tour or to learn more about the school and the enrolment application process.
- 3. Download the 'Foundation (Prep) Enrolment Information Pack for Parents and Carers.' The pack will be available from Monday 15 April 2024 and will include an application form. The school may also provide you with a copy of the form to complete.
- 4. Submit an enrolment application for Foundation (Prep) by Friday 26 July 2024.
- 5. You will be notified of the outcome of your application between Monday 29 July and Friday 9 August 2024. If you receive an enrolment offer, you should accept the offer by Friday 23 August 2024.
- 6. Take part in enrolment information and transition sessions during Term 4, 2024.
- 7. Your child will start Foundation (Prep) from Wednesday 29 January 2025.

Enrolment applications submitted after 26 July 2024 will be processed by the school as they are received, in accordance with the Department of Education's Placement Policy.

Your child has a right to enrol at their local school. Your child's local school is determined on the basis of their permanent residential address. Visit Find my School to locate your child's local school.

The <u>enrolling in a school</u> page can also help you to confirm your child's address for enrolment.

If you are seeking to apply to enrol your child in a school that is not their local school, you should read about <u>school zones</u> and how they work and how applications are prioritised using the Department of Education's Placement Policy found on the <u>enrolling in a school</u> page.


5. Enter the title and author, click search. Then locate the book from the list and click the title.

7. Then click Dashboard and you will be taken to your child's dashboard where you will see the book listed. Click Finish





We used our knowledge of capacity and mass to measure play doh.






During our writing sessions we have been exploring and creating fractured fairy tales.

And he said everything is so uncomfortable. He went to work but he worked for an hour. It made him more uncomfortable because when he was sitting on his chair it hurted his bum.







Other activities included toasting marshmallows on a fire and a guided tour at Fort Queenscliff.












