Smoking (including vaping) banned within 4 metres of entry to the school grounds

A friendly reminder that smoking is banned within 4 metres of the entry of any school ground. If you are a smoker, please ensure that you are more than 4 metres away from the school fence before you commence smoking.

Parking in front of the double gates in Raleigh's Road

A friendly reminder to please not park in front of the double gates in Raleigh's Road - before school, after school or during school times. This is clearly marked as a keep clear zone.

Parking in the disabled car park in Raleigh's Road

A friendly reminder to please ensure that you only park in the disabled car park if you have a valid disability permit. We provide this park for members of our community who need this adjustment. Like we make adjustments to curriculum programs, we also make adjustments to physical resources for our students.

Students should not be onsite prior to 8:15am unsupervised

Teachers officially start work at 8:18am with the first teacher on yard duty from 8:30am. Students should not be in the school yard prior to 8:15am unsupervised. Parents needing to have their child on site prior to 8:15am are required to utilise the Out of School Hours Care service. If students are on site prior to 8:15am unsupervised, parents will be contacted to collect them.



WHEN DO ABSENCES BECOME AN ISSUE?




The grade 1

Grade 3








Term 4 camp to Lady Northcote Recreation Camp.




